It's Never Too Late

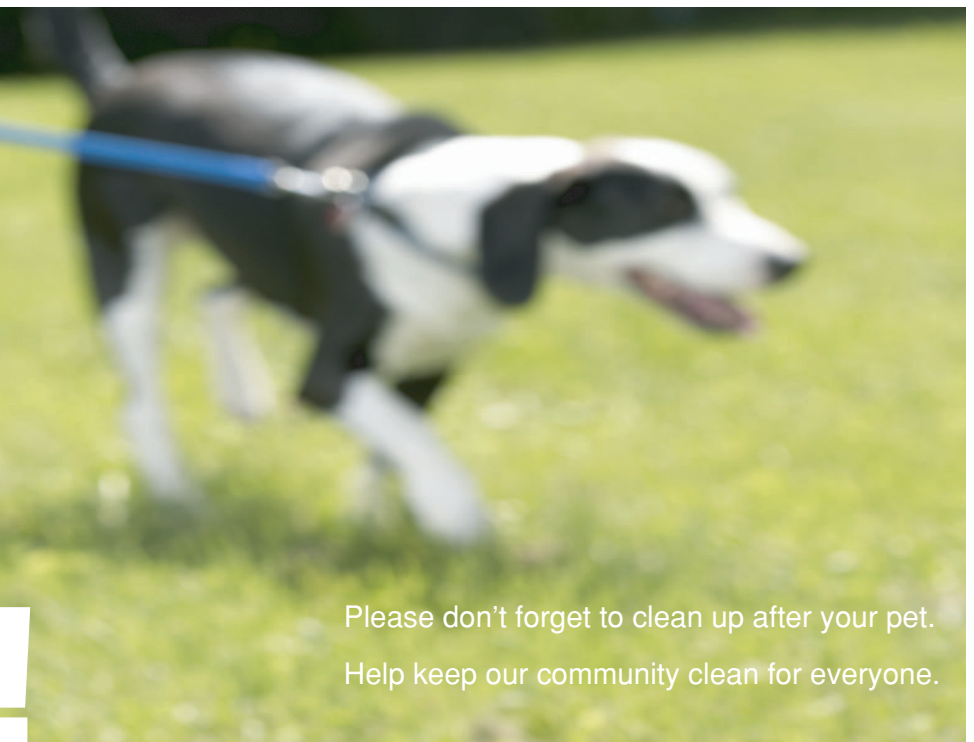
